

She has been an author on over 280 research publications and has had projects funded by the NIH, CDC, and a PCORI grant. For over 20 years, Dr. Rich-Edwards has been in an investigator in the national Nurses' Health Studies (NHS). Over the years her research has covered a number of issues related to women's reproductive health, from aspects of reproductive health predicting chronic disease, to fetal origins of adult disease, to predictors of preterm delivery and maternal depression.
